Auxcomm Training: Auxiliary Communication training, sponsored by OEC/ICTAP (Office of Emergency Communications / Interoperable Communications Technical Assistance Program) under the guidance of U.S. Department of Homeland Security was held on Dec 9 and 10 at the Memorial Hospital training facility in O'Fallon, Illinois. The St Clair Amateur Radio Club had four members that attended this training. They were Michael Petz, KA9HNT (club Vice President), Larry Wessels, K9LWW (club past President), Bill Carroll, KC9CIK (club President of St Louis and Suburban Radio Club, and Rebecca Carroll, KC9CIJ, (Chief coordinator for the MS Bike-a-Thon in September. The training was 20 hours (10 hours each day) of intense instruction ranging the spectrum from how to report in when called for duty, how to fill out the mired of forms, what the chain of command is and how you must follow it, to proper etiquette when on the air, or dealing with the other emergency action people. There were prerequisites that had to be completed before being accepted into the class. These are the online courses offered by Homeland Security through Federal Emergency Management Administration (FEMA) and consist of ICS-100, ICS-200, IS-00700.a, and IS-00800.b. (Anyone interested in completing these FEMA courses, see Larry, K9LWW, and he can guide you to the web site). It was a terrific weekend, and with the intense training, time seemed to pass so fast that you don't realize you spent 10 hours in a class room. The need is there and the opportunity to help in a very meaningful way in the time of an emergency is the inspiration that takes you through it. If we are ever called on, you need to be ready and hit the ground running (so to speak), because there is no time to train when the emergency is upon us. We hope the skills learned are never needed, but that is more unrealistic than being ready and staying ready. by Larry Wessel, K9LWW

In collaboration with Ron Morgan, AD9I, Illinois Section Manager, Robert Littler, W9DSR, ASEC and Debby Gray, WX9VOR, District 3 DEC...the announcement is being made to appoint Robert (Bob) Langsfeld WB9TZC as ADEC for District 4, Cook County serving the North West Central Dispatch System Communities (NWCDC). Cook County is a complex area involving many different communities within its border. With Bob's appointment, we will continue to further subdivide this area to ensure the best possible fit to provide the served agencies with amateur radio support.

NWCDS serves the following communities Arlington Hts. Police and Fire,

Buffalo Grove Police and Fire, Elk Grove Police and Fire,

Hoffman Estates Police and Fire, Inverness Police, Mount Prospect Police and Fire,

Palatine Police and Fire, Prospect Hts. Police, Rolling Meadows Police and Fire, Schaumburg Police and Fire,

Streamwood Police and Fire, Barrington Country Side Fire Protection District and the Palatine Rural Fire District

In this position Bob will be working with the Public Safety Access Points agencies and the Joint Emergency Coordinator to bring the rest of North West Central Dispatch System together. We have Palatine, Elk Grove, Hoffman Estates, and Schaumburg already meeting together with EM-COMM Round table and have the opportunity to bring the others in to strengthen our response and exercise team. Bob believes that the Joint Emergency Management System will be looking at the various volunteer groups in our PSAP like AUX COMM / ARES, MRC, CERT, and Fire Rehab forming a combined training and exercise program in the future.

Bob will be working with several clubs in the covered area and many of the area clubs provide public service to the communities and assist each other. He will also interface with the Salvation Army territorial headquarters here in Hoffman Estates as another served agency. This is in addition to serving three hospitals in his area.

From Bob, "My background as a ham goes back to Mt Prospect Civil Defense where I earned my Ham license. I spent time traveling to Olsen Electronics, Allied Radio, Lafayette and the Heath Kit store to build kits and projects. I got started in CB and SWL listening, learned electronics in High School and College and worked in Medical Imaging Electronics. Many of my class mates did the same and are still active Hams." "Ever since High School I was interested in Emergency Management and the operations side of the Fire Department. "I have been to countless public service events, floods and a tornado or two over the years as a Ham. Eventually an opportunity opened up for me to become the Emergency Management Coordinator in Hoffman Estates where I was a volunteer. I've been the Coordinator for the past several years." One of my believes is every Ham has the duty to serve the public and that it is necessary to justify the use of the radio spectrum we use on a daily basis.

Bob will be using his contacts with Local, County, and State Emergency Management Agencies, Red Cross, Salvation Army and our served Hospitals to promote and include them in ARES activities.

I would like to thank you all for your support of the ARRL and Amateur Radio. I want to take this opportunity to wish all the members of the ARRL in the Missouri Section a Merry Christmas, and the best in the coming New Year. Dan Henderson, N1ND, the Regulatory Information Manager American Radio Relay League, Inc. has contacted me about a Bill recently introduced in the Missouri State Legislature by Rep. Galen Higdon. Dan's statement was: The ARRL State Legislation watch has hit on a bill introduced to the MO legislature that could be a problem. MO H 1302 – removes the exemption for Amateur Radio in the cellphone law. There are several other bills on this topic but that all retain the exemption already in place. You and your SGL need to monitor this one and if this is the one that gets traction in the legislature will need to see if you can get the exemption reinserted to the bill.

The Bill Description is as follows. HB 1302 Prohibits the use of hand-held electronic wireless communications devices while driving non-commercial and commercial motor vehicles; but allows the use of such devices when used hands-free by operators of non-commercial motor vehicles who are fully licensed and eighteen years of age or older. It is important that the exemptions include Amateur Radio and it needs to have that language added to protect the Amateur Radio Operators legal ability to operate mobile.
