It is with heavy heart that I advise all members of the St. Clair County ARC of the passing of Mr. William Keller, ARS-WA9IUF as of 2:00 PM June 20th 2017.

I have known WA9IUF for more than 30 (+) years and he was the FIRST and ONLY Amateur Radio Club President to sign a working "support communications agreement" with the Illinois State Police where the ARES® /ARRL® affiliated operations would assist in the event of area wide need for disaster support communications. The agreement was signed in the Captain's office of ISP District 11 in Nov. of 1991. In part, the document read "... a framework of cooperation and a close working relationship with volunteer radio amateurs organized under the authority of the ARRL EC and officials of the Illinois State Police - District 11. It is intended through joint cooperation of the local resources available to both signees, the public will best be served under disaster, emergency or public service-related situations. This document is not meant to be considered legally binding; it is a statement of cooperation between these two parties."

It was WA9IUF's professionalism and demeanor as the President of the St. Clair Amateur Radio Club that made this document possible. I will always remember Bill's work in this area and he would attend the annual "Law Enforcement Day" - when we had them back in the 1990s, held at St. Clair Square and he would review our equipment displays and add his expertise to technical equipment displays.

I have worked with many "walk-a-thons" communication support activities through the SCARC with Bill as well and it was ALWAYS a pleasure. When my wife would attend an SCARC meeting with me, Bill was ALWAYS the first one to greet my XYL with the utmost "gentleman" type style as Pam would say to me.

WA9IUF- he will be GREATLY missed , not just in the amateur radio community, but to everyone who knew him. Our sympathies and prayers to his family.


