Thanks, to our VEs - Gary, N8GIL; Larry, K9LWW; Steve, KA0WBM and Randy KC9MZ.


Thanks to the Swansea Moose and Bob, WA9TUG for reserving the Moose Pavilion.

QRZ hosts papers by Dr. Ulrich Rohde



This transceiver is very clean, original box, manuals. I've tested the output on each band and its 100 watts or so. Audio sounds good on station receiver. This rig does not have the auto tune unit.

The Astron power supply has a broken rocker switch which selects volts or amps on the built in meter.

It looks like the Kenwood was bought to replace a malfunctioning Ten-Tec and never used. The owner went into a Home, both for \$450.

LOYAL... offers loyalty, encouragement and support to other amateurs, local clubs, the IARU Radio Society in their country, through which Amateur Radio in their country is represented nationally and internationally.

PROGRESSIVE... keeps their station up to date. It is well-built and efficient. Their operating practice is above reproach.

FRIENDLY... operates slowly and patiently when requested; offers friendly advice and counsel to beginners; kind assistance, cooperation and consideration for the interests of others. These are the marks of the amateur spirit.

BALANCED...Radio is a hobby, never interfering with duties owed to family, job, school or community.

PATRIOTIC...their station and skills are always ready for service to country and community.



THE RADIO AMATEUR WILL BE PROTECTED

"In certain countries, the government has prohibited the use of receiving instruments except upon payment of a fee. . . . I believe that we ought to allow anyone to put in receiving stations who wishes to do so. But the immediate problem arises of who will do the broadcasting, and what will be his purpose. It is my belief that, with the variations that can be given through different wavelengths, through different times of day, and through the staggering of stations of different wavelengths in different parts of the country, it will be possible to accommodate the most proper demands and at the same time to protect that precious thing—the American small boy, to whom so much of this rapid expansion of interest is due."
