The above and their counterparts in surrounding counties formed the communications arm of the "Southwest Illinois Mutual Aid Area" S.W.I.M.A.A. Its home was the old county poor-farm (this later was the location of Emergency Services Disaster Agency).

The St. Clair Amateur Radio club has a long history of supporting local agencies in emergency situations. We support the St. Clair County Emergency Management Agency (EMA), Illinois State Police, our Region 4 RHCC Hospital (Belleville Memorial) and coordinate the coverage of the other 15 hospitals in Region 4.

Another key public service activity is supporting the Skywarn net and reporting severe weather conditions to the National Weather Service office in St. Charles

Yearly club activities include the Belleville Shriners Parade, Field Day, testing sessions, bike races, IL QSO Party plus many other club functions throughout the year.

REPEATERS

The SCARC club station, K9GXU, provides coordinated repeaters. Operating on

The first 3 repeaters are located on Turkey Hill at the S.A.V.E. site, just outside of Belleville, IL. The facilities for the repeaters are donated to the club by S.A.V.E.
