The APRS system is running on a Yaesu FT-2700RH running 25 Watts, a Kantronics KPC-9612 TNC, UI-View32 Software running on a Compaq Deskpro EN P833 MHz PC and a Comet GP-15 Antenna

ECHOLINK

(Node 258260)

In addition to APRS, the Club's UHF repeater is now connected to Echolink. Echolink allows users from all over the world to connect to our repeater and talk to us here as if they were local. Echolink also allows local RF users to key in special commands and connect our repeater to other Echolink users, repeaters or links around the world.

To access Echolink from a computer, connect to node #258260. If you are accessing Echolink from the UHF repeater, here are some commonly used DTMF codes:

To connect to a specific node	Send 5 + [node #]
To disconnect from a node	Send 5 + # Sign
To disconnect from all nodes	Send 5 + # #
To check the status of Echolink	Send 5 + 08
To Connect to a Random Node	Send 5 + 00
To Connect to a Random Link	Send 5 + 01
To Connect to a Random User	Send 5 + 03
